'Members' Displays: Famous People A, B and C.'

The **President Geoff Blackwell** began the session with a discussion of the mathematics of 2-3-5-8, and gave a display of famous mathematicians whose surname began with the first three letters of the alphabet. James H. Grayson gave a display of stamps from the Republic of China and the People's Republic of China with a portrait of Confucius. The ROC issued stamps several times from 1947 to the end of the century, but the PRC did not issue a stamp with Confucius until 2000 well after the Cultural Revolution. **Richard Hindle** gave a display of stamps portraying the explorers of Australia George Bass and his colleague Matthew Flinders, James Cook, Gregory Blaxland and his colleagues William Lawson and William Wentworth and their activities. John Hunter began with a discussion of the meaning of 'famous' and 'distinguished' and gave a display of the huge variety of US stamps dedicated to Presidents, politicians, diplomats, actors and radio-TV-film celebrities, musicians, singers, conductors, authors, poets, scientists, sportsman, explorers, and native Americans.. Paul **Johnson** gave a presentation of famous people whose reputation went up or down displaying stamps of Alphonse XIII of Spain, 'Baby Doc' of Haiti, Christian X of Denmark, and Sir Edward Codrington, a naval officer who played an important role at the Battles of Trafalgar, and Navarino (Greek independence against the Ottoman Empire). **Donald Radley** showed three stamps displaying images Charles I, II and III.
