#### **ROYAL MAIL PRICE INCREASE!**

On 4th September, news was released that in less than a month, stamps are to cost more.

First-class stamp prices will rise by 14% for standard size letters, Royal Mail has confirmed. From Monday 2 October, the cost of a first-class stamp will be hiked to £1.25 (up 15p from £1.10).

Other stamp prices will also rise, though standard second-class stamps will remain at their current price of 75p.

### An item on Ebay by Neil Ritchie

What caught my eye on Ebay at the end of January 2023 was a 1939 Charity issue miniature sheet on sale at the eye watering "buy it now" price of £6406.22.

I had to investigate further, as I had never come across this issue before (I know I live a sheltered life) and I immediately wanted to find out all the different permutations (if any) in which you could buy this issue and why this particular miniature sheet was up for sale at that staggering amount.



Well it was interesting but first the background - this charity miniature sheet depicting Valazquez paintings, Edfil 34 & 35, and was issued on the 12 Oct 1939 on behalf of the Orphans of Postal Employees. It was produced in perforate and imperforate states, face value was 1Pts 90c, the perforate was on sale at 5 Ptas and imperforate 20 Ptas. The print run for the imperforate sheet is reported to be 3000 and the perforate 17,000. The sheets were numbered and it would appear, if the print run numbers are correct, that the perforated was numbered 1 to 16999 and the imperforate 17000 to 19999, but this is only my supposition. Which may explain why the sheet above is for sale at such a huge figure - it has not been numbered. It comes with an expert's certificate but as usual there is no explanation as to how that opinion was made.

So how much do these sheets sell at and how many variates are there to buy to make a comprehensive collection?



Here are the front and rear views of a couple of miniature sheets unmounted mint (MNH) that could be bought in Jan 2023 together for a "buy it now" price of £204.40 including postage. But is this a reasonable amount? the proof of current values is always in how much collectors are willing to pay and as usual Ebay allows you to find out. From December 2022 to end of January 2023 the following were sold:

\* there were a couple sold and these are the two prices obtained.
Oddly there were a number of loose perforate and imperforate stamps being offered for sale, but in my time frame there were none noted as having been sold. Were they issued as individual stamps? or did someone cut up a sheet?
